



Remote Teaching

Teachers will deliver either a Live Lesson or set an 'On Demand' resource such as a video or a narrated document. All instructions are issued on Satchel:One.

Live Lesson

Teachers deliver the lesson via MS Teams. Students cameras and mics are off. The delivery of content will commonly not take the entire lesson. Students will be set work to complete and the teacher will usually remain online to answer questions via the chat function. The lesson is recorded in Teams so students who were not available to participate 'live' can re-watch the lesson.



Online support

Teachers might deliver an online live lesson or set an on demand resource. They will then remain online and available for students to access if they require support. Teachers will instruct students to use either the chat function on Teams or the comments feature on Satchel:One.



On Demand

This involves the teacher creating a video using software such as Loom, where they talk students through the content to be learned during the lesson. This might involve explanations, instructions for tasks, or demonstrations. Teachers might also narrate a PowerPoint for example, or direct students towards a high quality video resource such as an Oak Academy lesson.



Feedback

Teachers will use a range of strategies to provide students with feedback on their work and understanding. This might involve work being submitted and marked, whole class feedback, use of the chat feature to provide instant feedback, verbal feedback, and online quizzes.



Subject variation

All of the subjects within our broad curriculum offer vary in the knowledge and skills that are required. This means the method of delivery will vary from subject to subject and our teachers may use methods that are unique and specific to their curriculum.
