What is a dictatorship? 10 POINTS	If you have studied the 20 th century, create a fact-file on one dictator. For example, Hitler, Stalin or Mussolini. 10 POINTS	If you have studied the 20 th century, choose one key historical character and write 50 words about them. 10 POINTS	What is a revolution? 10 POINTS	Research a revolution. E.g. the American Revolution, the French Revolution, the Industrial Revolution in the United Kingdom or the Russian Revolution. 10 POINTS	Draw a diagram that represents the word revolution. 10 POINTS	Explain your drawing of the word revolution to someone else. 10 POINTS	Write out 7 facts about the leader(s) of your chosen revolution. 10 POINTS	Did the revolution you chose to research create change? If so, what kind of change? 10 POINTS	Learn 2 key historical words a day. Create a glossary. E.g. Feudal, Monarch, Communist. 10 POINTS
If you can, talk to an older person in your family over the phone. Ask them about the most important historical event they have experienced in their life. 10 POINTS	Find out 7 pieces of information about the event discussed in your phone conversation with an older family member. 10 POINTS	Transform the 7 pieces of information into 7 pictures about the event. 10 POINTS	Create a drawing or cartoon of the event in the previous boxes. Use as much information as you can. 10 POINTS	Write a list of all the "things" or evidence that historians can use to increase our understanding of the past. E.g. a diary 10 POINTS	Choose 3 from your list of evidence. Which do you think are the most <i>useful</i> and why? 10 POINTS	Choose 3 from your list of evidence. Which do you think are the most <i>reliable</i> and why? 10 POINTS	Create a 5-minute talk on your favourite topic/event/person in history. 10 POINTS	Deliver your talk. What would you add/remove from the talk? 10 POINTS	Reduce your talk down to 25 words. 10 POINTS
