Dear parents and carers,

We were delighted to receive the news on Monday that students will begin returning to schools in England from March 8th. Since then we have been working on our plans for the wider re-opening of UCC. There has been a huge amount to consider as there are so many factors and variable involved. Therefore, rather than rushing a plan out at an earlier point this week, we have taken a bit more time to work out the most effective way to get our students back into school as quickly and safely as possible. There is a <u>lot</u> of information to digest in this bulletin, so please take the time to read through everything carefully.

Testing

Our logistical challenge has been planning how to safely test 900 students, whilst keeping them apart so that students can return to school following their first negative test. This planned approach will prevent those unknowingly carrying COVID 19 from transmitting it to other students, staff or spreading it to the wider community. Lateral Flow Testing is an additional risk mitigation step to ensure asymptomatic cases are identified before they start attending face to face lessons so that we reduce the number of students and staff contacts who need to isolate. Therefore it is critical that we all support one another by consenting to students being tested to keep our community safe.

Initially, students will only come into school on their designated testing day at an appointed time to undertake a test – this will be organised in tutor groups. Once tested they will then immediately return home. To do this we will be relying on parents/carers transporting students into school for the test to avoid any mingling with others. Once the first test has been completed, students will return home. If the test result is positive or void then you will be contacted by the testing team otherwise please presume it is negative. If you do not receive a phone call your child will be able to return to school on their designated return day. The testing and return to lessons dates can be found in the summary timetable below.

*Test 1 – students should come into school for their test and then return home immediately, mixing with no-one outside of their household

**Remote Learning – on the days when students are taking 'Test 1' there will be only 'On Demand' resources provided by teachers, with no live lessons for that particular year group

Tuesday 9th March - Students return to face to face teaching in school

<u>Year 7</u>

Tuesday 9th March - Students should come into school at the designated time for their tutor group and complete a test before going straight home

Wednesday 10th March - Students return to face to face teaching in school

<u>Year 8</u>

Wednesday 10th March - Students should come into school at the designated time for their tutor group and complete a test before going straight home

Thursday 11th March - Students return to face to face teaching in school

<u>Key Worker Provision</u> – these students have been participating in testing whilst in school throughout this week. From 8th March they will follow their normal timetable in school. This means that teaching staff will be expected to teach these students alongside their remote teaching responsibilities for year groups that have not yet returned.

Other key points to be aware of regarding testing

- Testing will be self-administered by students supported carefully by our trained and experienced staff.
- This will familiarise students with how to self-swab properly in a supervised safe setting in school.
- Once students have completed three Lateral Flow Tests, 3-5 days apart they will transition to home testing.
- More details on home testing and home test kits will follow once students are back in school.
- If you have not yet provided consent then please complete the form <u>here</u>
- Students MUST wear a face mask when they arrive at school for their first test (unless exempt on medical grounds).
- For the first test school uniform is not required as students will be returning home immediately after their test.

Volunteers required

Our in-school testing team have done a magnificent job in creating our Asymptomatic Testing Site (ATS). The ATS has a crucial role to play in our students returning to school. Whole school approach

All of the media headlines about 'catch-up', 'lost learning' etc are deeply unhelpful and we have an important role to play in not making this some kind of self-fulfilling prophecy of doom for our students. Yes, they have missed a lot of school, and yes, we know that regardless of the quality of our remote provision we cannot replicate the impact of excellent face-to-face teaching. Therefore, I have asked staff to all have a number of key points in mind when students return:


- teach students as well as you possibly can do and reignite a love of learning with all your classes
- use positive language and be relentlessly optimistic with them
- be empathetic and understanding in your approaches, but insist on high standards and high expectations
- supporting the wellbeing of our students is important and we should treat them all as individuals. We should not make assumptions about how they have been affected by the lockdown and listen to them about their individual concerns when they wish to talk to us.

GCSE qualifications

The <u>press release</u> from yesterday outlined how GCSEs will be awarded this summer. 'Fairness and flexibility' for schools and students is the tag line for this announcement and this means that we will have some autonomy in the process we use to generate evidence that is as valid and reliable as possible so that we award appropriate grades. Schools will have to submit grades on June 18thand the results day will be 12thAugust. Our focus for Year 11 will be on *teaching* not *testing* when we return. There will be assessments conducted between now and the end of May, but these will be carefully planned and communicated so that students are very clear on what they will be assessed on and when. It is important that Year 11 continue to work diligently throughout next week on their remote learning and then apply themselves fully when we return to school. The graphic below from Ofqual provides a useful summary of the national guidance schools will be following.
