The course introduces and extends learners' insight into and exploration of both the geography of the UK and the wider world. Learners are equipped with a wide range of geographical skills. The content is contextualised through case studies. Learners study the diverse and dynamic geography of the UK. They will gain an appreciation of the changes to the UK's geography and the processes which drive them. This includes the study of the natural landscapes which define the UK, the people of the UK and the environmental challenges facing the UK. Learners explore the complexities of the planet and the interconnections that take place in the wider world. Learners explore key Geographical concepts and areas of knowledge spanning ecosystems, people of the planet and world environmental threats.</p>
