How UCC can help you...

In the absence of a face-to-face post-16 open evening this year we hope that this virtual experience will offer you an overview of our local post-16 provision and provide a springboard to facilitate further research into possible courses and providers for your child for when they leave UCC.

The first slide gives you a useful overview of the different post-16 options open to year 11, explaining what they are and what each type of qualification can lead to. You will see there is a great deal of choice available and we encourage our students to be open-minded about what might best suit their future career aspirations.

The rest of the slides cover the majority of our local providers, listed in alphabetical order. Here you will find brief overview information as well as links to up-to-date prospectuses, admissions arrangements, transport etc.

The information available here will be followed up with a careers week and careers interviews for all year 11 students in November to ensure they have a clear post-16 action plan. We will support students with extra interviews if required to ensure that all our students are happy with their post-16 choices and are able to access them from September 2021.



Why might you apply?

Uppingham School increases the size of Year 11 by 25% at sixth form level. 50 pupils join us at this point: 30-35 girls and 15-20 boys.

Although a boarding school, we have day pupils too who benefit from the opportunities available in a seven day a week environment. Day pupil numbers are increasing here – 14 last year, 22 this year, 30+ in 2021

There is a wide range of opportunity both <u>academically</u> and <u>outside the classroom</u> (meet some teachers via the links).

Financial support can be available through means tested scholarship and bursary awards.

How to Apply
